On behalf of the project group, we are happy to invite you to the MAGALOG kick-off seminar in Bergen, Norway, 16 January 2007. The seminar will be followed by excursions 17 January where it will be possible to visit different LNG-facilities in the region, such as an LNG-plant, an LNG-filling station, an LNG driven vessel and a Rolls Royce gas engine factory.

Norway is already ahead when it comes to LNG ship design. The MAGALOG project will share Norwegian experiences with northern European countries and investigate possible supply chains for LNG in the Baltic.

The seminar should be of interest for all actors in the maritime sector, such as port authorities, ship owners, naval designers, shipyards, engine producers, tank producers, pollution control authorities, maritime organizations, local and central governments and political parties.

On the doorstep to cleaner ships

In Norway Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) already fuels one ferry, two supply vessels and one LNG-carrier. In 2007, 5 more ferries, two more supply vessels and two coast guard vessels will be in operation. Future taxes and regulations seem to accelerate the change from fuel oil to liquefied natural gas. Ship owners, shipyards and engine makers have recognised LNG as a cleaner and possibly more economic fuel. On this background project MAGALOG is launched.

Project MAGALOG is a contribution to address port emission problems in Europe, with a special focus on the Baltic Sea, through the establishment of an alternative fuel supply chain. The project will contain both a market study and a technical feasibility study. Three Norwegian, two German and one Polish partner will elaborate the studies. The partners represent the gas industry, scientific organizations, gas interest organizations, non-governmental organizations, port authorities and city energy suppliers. Port cities, national and EU bodies, the shipping industry and other key actors are to be included as indirect participants. One important output of MAGALOG is to prepare for pioneer actions demonstrating the role of LNG in marine fuel and city challenges in the Baltic area. These results should be represented in the context of transferability to other areas in the EU.

The conference will be held at Radisson SAS Royal Hotel at Bryggen. Address and phone number are listed at a later page together with alternative hotels in the vicinity.
